The year started off with the retirement of City Clerk Ann Matera who had served the city faithfully for 34 years. Ken Russell was elevated to city clerk and new hire, Joy Bennett started as assistant clerk and Annette Brown as city treasurer. This allows the city to have separation of duties, with all to be trained to do whatever is needed to make the office run efficiently. Highlights of the year:

Public Works

This department is responsible for maintaining city, cemeteries, leaf pickup, mowing, snow removal, buildings and all the equipment in their department. By these employees doing the routine maintain to all their equipment and repairs to the buildings the city owns, it is a great savings to the city. This department had a total of 58 grave (Main Street and Guthrie Street) opening and closing this year.

Police Department

Training/New Employee

Fire Department

With around twenty-one volunteer firemen, this department has made 536 runs to date, medical, fire, wrecks, etc. We also maintain a 5th class fire rating which is vitally important to citizens of Horse Cave as well of any property within five miles of either fire station to help keep insurance premium as low as possible. Other improvements this year:
