HORSE CAVE CITY COUNCIL

October 13, 2014

The Horse Cave City Council met in regular session Monday, October 13, 2014, at 6:00 P.M. at City Hall. Present were Mayor Randall Curry, council members Vickie Rogers, Sue Nunn, Perry Martin, Ray Wilcoxson, Jackie Buckingham and David Lindsey. Mayor Curry declared that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order.

The prayer and pledge to the American flag was led by Mayor Curry.

Motion was made by Vickie Rogers, seconded by Sue Nunn, that the minutes of the September meeting be approved as corrected. Motion carried 6-0.

OLD BUSINESS

NEW BUSINESS

Large Item Pickup – Mayor Curry announced that the large item pickup would be held from Thursday through Saturday October 16-18 at the maintenance building. Crews would be picking up item from residents who called in and could not transport them to the site.

Trick or Treat Hours – Motion was made by Jackie Buckingham, seconded by Ray Wilcoxson, that Trick or Treat Hours would be from 5:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M. Halloween evening. Motion carried 6-0.

Citizen Concerns – Lindel Taylor approached the council with a personnel matter. He is not a resident of Horse Cave. (Correction requested 11/10/14)

Council Concerns – David Lindsey asked why glass is no longer accepted in the recycling trailer. Maintenance supervisor Jimmy Martin stated that the recycling center would not accept it for recycling because it had no value, and he had felt that expanding the cardboard space was a better use for the trailer.

Jackie Buckingham reported that Charles Priddy had bid \$25,100 on the Maple Street park work. Dean Froedge and Chuck Purlee bid \$25,250.

Buckingham also asked about the city permitting golf carts for operation on public roadways. Police Chief Sean Henry distributed copies of KRS 189.286 concerning operation of golf carts in such a manner.
